WELCOME RYAN HOFFMAN – OUTING'S CHAIRMAN

Sponsor Spotlight – Dr. Eric Kohn

Dr. Eric Kohn is our youth director and one of our monthly sponsors with St. Cloud Chapter of Muskies Inc. He has been chasing muskies for the past 15 years. He is a physical therapist at St. Cloud Orthopedics/Orthopedic Sports Center since 1999. He is also a professor at St. John's University.

What is your Job?

I am a physical therapist with a specialty in orthopedics and sports medicine. I graduated from St. John's University and attended graduate school at University of Mary in Bismarck for my Master's and St Scholastica for my Doctorate. I am a therapist at St. Cloud Orthopedics.

Why did you choose physical therapy?

Physical therapy allowed me the ability to serve people by helping them return to their previous activity level. I work to improve my patient's function and promote a quicker recovery to their daily activities. My patients are all ages from young to old. I treat from head to toes and everything in between.

What makes your job rewarding?

Watching a patient meet their goals creates more passion in me to help others Patients have many goals such as walking, hugging their grand kids, returning to work or to be back on the field for a professional sports team. They are all equally important in my eyes.

What is the biggest change you have seen over the past years in your profession?

I have seen an increase in total knees, hips and shoulders due to the active lifestyle of the baby boomer generation. They are wearing out their joints earlier and want to return back to their active lifestyle. Therefore, joint replacement has been big in the last few years. In addition, the increase in female participation in sports has led to more injuries to females. I think we are starting to correct this sooner with early education on more effective training and injury prevention.

What was your first experience in musky fishing?

My college roommate took me to Bone Lake in WI and I had a low 40 inch follow on a M and G spinnerbait. The fish didn't bite but I was hooked from then on.

What was your most memorable day musky fishing?

One evening on Lake Vermillion I caught a 50" and 51" fish. Everything came together that night, moon rise, incoming front, wind etc. It was one of those special times on the water when everything was going and you were there to be a part of it.

If you only could take 3 lures to fish for a week at your favorite lake, what would they be?

Tough one...Blue/silver Cowgirl, black 8" reef hawg, and black/red pacemaker...

Next in would be a 10" weighted Suick walleye color that I got from Mike Ruff and #5 blue fox vibrax in black.

The lasting friendships I have made over the last 15 years are the biggest reason I am a part of the chapter. I have learned so much and fished with so many members. I did want to give you and the membership an update on that garbage can project that you supported a few years back. I have been able to keep up with maintaining the removal of trash, and I have to say that is genuinely made a difference on the shorelines of the Mississippi in Sartell. Anglers take the time to clean up, I take three 55 gallon garbage bags out of there per year that would normally sit among the rocks and eventually move downstream.

There's been a learning curve, including cutting holes in the bottom of the barrel and the bags for drainage, stagnant water makes for a pretty awful smell:-)

PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT By Aaron Meyer


Not a lot new this month. The DNR continues to work towards a method of improved northern pike management that will be acceptable to the public. We will stay closely involved in this process and let you know of any developments.

They are also getting closer to moving forward with official proposals for stocking several new muskie waters. This is pretty exciting!!

We are now into the heart of summer, with hot days, warm water, and active muskies. Please remember that this is the time when muskies are most susceptible to the stresses of being caught. The high water temps of midsummer amplify the harmful effects of fighting and being handled. There is no other time when you are as likely to see a muskie suffer post-release mortality as you are right now. Please do everything you can to minimize the amount of time you handle these fish. Make sure your release tools are always easily accessible BEFORE you begin fishing. Also, remember that the bigger the fish are even more fragile than the rest.

Just a reminder, I've heard the water temps have hit 80 so take care of the fish if you hook up. Take a quick picture and get them back in the water as soon as you can.







