PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT By Aaron Meyer

I'd like to thank everyone who came out to hear my seminar at the least meeting. My talk revolved around several topics that I feel are very important to consistently putting big fish in the boat. One of the keys I tried to drive home is that you will rarely hear about, or come across some new lure, secret technique, or idea that will be a huge revelation causing you to suddenly catch a ton of big fish. Much of what it takes to bring your success to the next level is understanding and utilizing ideas and information that you aleady have, and putting them to work the right way at the right time. It's much more than using good lures on good spots. Once you know when, where, and how the fish react to different conditions you can duplicate your success to put more fish in the boat on a daily basis as well as a yearly basis.

I got to be part of a really cool experience about a week ago... My dad and I were able to help the DNR with putting PIT tags into the muskie fingerlings being stocked into the Horseshoe Chain. Our chapter, along with the North Metro chapter, was able to secure a grant through the Hugh Becker Foundation to help fund a tagging study on the Horseshoe Chain. PIT tags are little inserts, about the size of a grain of rice, that work kind of like a bar code scanner. The DNR will be doing a multiple-year study on the muskies being stocked in The Chain. These tags will help them assess thing like survivability and growth rates, and help them understand the best ways to manage muskie populations throughout the state. Area Fisheries Supervisor Joe Stewig is in charge of the stocking and tagging, and will be our speaker at the November 19th meeting, so I'll let him explain the details.

For me, after being so involved with the whole process of starting The Chain's stocking program, being a small part of this study really brought the experience full circle. It was a long road, with a lot of up's and down's, but we accomplished something that we'll all be able to enjoy and be proud of!




Mike Ruff -- Clearing Out Remaining Merchandise.


