


Contest Report By Marc Jefferson


Another season is in the bag and as of right now we have 20 November fish on the club list for November, spread out between 6 members, making it the best month of this season, and all but one fish was caught on live bait. This is also a month shortened by deer season and this year, weather, effectively making it a three week month. Bryan Thompson takes last fish of year honors with a double on the 24th at Minnetonka. Jake Anderson had a good month with 5 fish, including current big fish of the month at 50.5" as well as a couple 48.5"s and a 48" for a very nice November average, and he also takes big fish of the month in October with a 50" he caught on the 27th. His 10 registered fish this year also averaged a whopping 47.5" and he now has big fish for the last 3 months. Eric Poissant was in a tree stand most of the month but he managed to pop a fish on an outing to Alex, and Nate Rose also put a 46.5" in the net from Alex on the 16th. Aaron Starry doesn't need suckers, he put up a 47" on a bulldawg from Sugar this month, and I took advantage of a great sucker bite in the metro and had a lot of fun this month. Nick DeBoer did not participate in the contest this season but deserves a nod for surpassing his personal goal of 40 fish this year, despite travelling a lot for work and not relying on suckers too much in November like many of us. I'll confess that I'm usually ready for the season to be over once it is, getting constantly pounded by the cold and wind wears me out. The sucker bite got started late here in the east metro due to a long and lingering turnover. I did enjoy my two biggest sucker fish off White Bear Lake on back to back trips of 48", but fish never really set up hard on some of the normal spots. My fall season was really made by exploring some new water that I hadn't fished too much before and finding some pretty impressive fish, including the biggest fish I've had in my boat at 52", a 50" PB for another buddy, both of which we got to watch eat the boatside sucker. Anyone who has fished with me in the fall knows I'm a little uptight about my suckers and rigs, but of the 25 or so fish that ate suckers in my boat this fall and all 25 got hooks into them, I lost one because I tried to muscle it into the net and it was a little stronger than I thought, and I lost one because I didn't check the drag before I set the hook, which was really loose. We also caught a lot more fish than usual on the boatside sucker and that's always a good show. In December we will have our final contest standings and some more season recap, thanks to everyone who registered fish this year.



PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT By Aaron Meyer

Well, it's over, and much too soon. I had high hopes for some big fish over the long Thanksgiving weekend, but the ice claimed the lakes too early. Most of the lakes throughout Minnesota froze up at least a week before the close of muskie season, and even the warmer metro lakes were locked up prior to Thanksgiving. Nothing you can do but pack up your gear and start looking forward to next year!

I want to thank Joe Stewig from the DNR for his great presentation at our last meeting. For those who weren't there, Joe is the new Area Fisheries Supervisor in Montrose, and is in charge of managing the Horseshoe Chain. He gave us some great information regarding the PIT tagging study being done on the muskies being stocked there.

Joe also talked about a couple other interesting things. One is a creel survey that will be done on The Chain during the winter of 2014, through the summer and winter of 2015. Another was that the study "Fish Community Responses to Muskie Stocking in MN Lakes" has been published in the North American Journal of Fisheries Management. This is the biological study that we've stood behind as proof that stocking muskies has no negative impact on our fisheries. Having it officially published in the NAJFM means that it has been reviewed and inspected by other fisheries managers and biologists throughout the country, and found to be scientifically sound. This validates it as accurate and useful, and allows it to be used legitimately throughout the country as a guideline for fisheries management. This strengthens our use of the study to promote responsible muskie stocking in selected lakes throughout Minnesota.
