





PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT By Aaron Meyer

Well who would've guessed- just when fishing was really getting going we got slammed by major cold fronts on two consecutive weekends! When I hit the water Saturday morning it was 38 degrees and windy! Is it September?! Summer cold fronts are notorious for shutting down the bite, and that often proves to be the case. Keep in mind, however, that they are not always the kiss of death. Fish can still be caught, in fact, and sometimes cold fronts trigger really good fishing. You might just have to go against the grain a little and change your thinking to put yourself in the right place. This past weekend was a good example of both sides of that coin. The wind and cold blew in on Friday. On Saturday, a couple friends and I had 4 very nice muskies attack lures, while having zero follows. On Sunday we had 3 lazy follows and zero hits. Go figure! I like this cooler weather anyway, and I think it's going to put our water temps into a very comfortable range for the rest of the summer.

Something noteworthy was presented to us at the last Esox Workshop. The pike population in Mille Lacs has at least doubled in recent years! Mille Lacs still has one of the healthiest, most balanced pike populations in the state, but the DNR would like to see the population growth slowed down. They've opened up the slot limit a bit, hoping to encourage more pike harvest. The protected slot is now 33-40 inches. Initially, this sounded like a really bad idea, going against what works on most other lakes. Generally speaking, keeping pike larger than about 24 inches contributes significantly to the wide-spread hammer handle pike problems we have on many lakes. It's always best to keep the smaller pike, including in this situation, but the rapid growth rate of pike in Mille Lacs allows for harvest of slighlty bigger pike without causing those problems. So, next time you go to Mille Lacs bring a cooler. Put a pike on ice and bring it home-they're pretty tasty!

Our August speaker will be Stanley Morgan. Stanley spoke for us once before, and everyone who was there was thoroughly entertained! Stanley was an avid, die hard muskie fisherman who fell in love with fishing big saltwater fish. So much so that he moved to Florida and became a guide and charter captain. He also really got into fly fishing. Well, now he's back in MN for the summer. He'll be speaking on fly fishing for muskies, and if we're lucky he might even discuss river muskies a little bit! I'd venture to say he's probably got some tricks he learned in salt water that would apply to catching muskies as well. It's going to be a great meeting- don't miss it!
