We have now had one complete year of presentations by members of lake of the month and I want to thank every one of you for your participation. In May, Troy Schmitz gave us an overview of Lobster Lake. This lake, near Alexandria, is a perfect alternative to Miltona on big wind days if you want to fish that area of the state. Troy gave everyone a strategy for fishing the lake even if you have never been on the lake before. He even had lake maps printed out so we could take notes. Thank you Troy!

We have a special extended version of lake of the month in July, We'll give Dave Mendel extra time to tell us how to fish Woman Lake in the Leech Lake area. Dave always gives great presentations so you won't want to miss this. Marc Jefferson has volunteered to come up in August and tell us how to fish one of the Metro Lakes he knows quite well, White Bear Lake.

### PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT . . . . . By Aaron Meyer

Well, it seems nothing can ever go smoothly when it comes to muskie management. We're still riding high after our victory in the Legislature. The new 54 inch size limit has been written into law and will go into effect next year. This has been very well received within the DNR- both in Upper Management and in the Area Offices. There are, however, two Fisheries Offices who are looking to keep the lakes in their areas at 48 inches. The two lakes in question are Fox and French, in southern MN. It appears that the managers of those lakes are still stuck in the "catch and kill" mentality of the 1950's. They seem to be ignoring all the support this new regulation got from anglers and businesses all across the state.

Moreover, they are ignoring the true intention of the new law and the stipulation it contains for exempting specific lakes. As written by lawmakers, and supported by the muskie community, the Legislation aims to put all Leech Lake strain muskie lakes on an even plane with a 54 inch regulation. It contains an exemption clause so that the DNR can leave lakes containing Shoepac strain fish at 48 inches if they choose to. It is not intended to allow lakes with Leech lake strain fish to be arbitrarily chosen and removed from the 54 inch rule.


Both of these lakes contain the Leech Lake strain of muskies, and both have a history of producing fish in the mid-50-inch range. They also both have a history of losing some very large fish to harvest. These are exactly the kind of lakes this new regulation is intended for!

Tim Goeman, the Regional Fisheries Manager who leads the Esox Workshops for the DNR, has recommended setting these two lakes at 54 inches. Let's get some input going and let them know we agree!



#### **High School Regional Muskie Tournament**

The Brainerd Lakes Chapter of Muskies Inc., in cooperation with the St. Cloud Chapter, held their 5<sup>th</sup> annual High School Regional Muskie tournament on June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014 on Lake Alexander. Eleven teams from 7 different schools participated in the event. Weather was cooperative in relation to being able to fish but post frontal, blue bird sky conditions made getting muskies to open their mouths quite difficult. All teams reported seeing fish but no muskies were boated for the tournament. Following tournament protocol, the top 4 teams were then determined based on the largest pike. The top honors were taken by Kyle Buchholz, and Tyler Madsen of Becker who measured a 28 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch pike. The top four teams were as follows: 2<sup>nd</sup> Place: Pete Babler and Kyle Olson of Foley (26 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch pike), 3<sup>rd</sup> Place: Kyle Billmeyer and Alex Helmin of Royalton (26 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch pike), and in 4<sup>th</sup> Place: Grant Madison and Caitlin Stark of Brainerd (21 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch pike). All participating teams received a number of lures and those participants who attended one of the MI meetings featuring local Lowrance staff members went into a drawing for a new Lowrance Elite 5 GPS/Sonar unit. Jon Gottwalt of Little Falls was the lucky winter of this prize package.
