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


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MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Cold Weather Fishing Precautions By Eric Kohn

It is that time of the year again....Time to think about cold weather and fishing. A time when you can catch a big, healthy musky and also when you can catch something yourself called hypothermia. There are some simple steps you can take to preventing hypothermia.

- 1. Dress in layers- this is the most efficient way to prevent heat loss, try warm weather synthetic layers like Under Armour
- 2. Wear a stocking cap most of our heat is lost through the top of our head (Our mother's were right!)
- 3. Wear a face mask- this eliminates possible frostbite to the face which has lots of blood vessels near the surface
- 4. Use water proof gloves- use mitten chopper style when moving between spots to allow fingers and hands to warm faster
- 5. Use hand and foot warmers in your gloves and boots- these little sand bags are ideal to use while fishing
- 6. Eat plenty of food throughout the day-small meals with lots of carbs throughout the day keeps metabolism up and body heating.
- 7. Drink plenty of liquids- this increases blood flow to the extremities..warm liquid best...alcohol worst..

Two last points-

Alcohol and cold weather fishing does not mix well for few reasons. It thins your blood which promotes heat loss, decreases sensation and therefore you may not feel the frostbite starting in your fingers and face, and finally it decreases coordination in case a true emergency would arise like falling into icy water. Be smart, have a drink after and celebrate a fun and successful fishing adventure. Need another example of how cold weather and alcohol do not mix....see Lambeau field crowd in December...Sorry Bruce, had to throw that in.

The benefits of wool. Now is the time to be wearing your wool clothes especially wool socks. The reasons are simple. Wool is less densely packed when compared to cotton and hold in air pockets, these pockets help to hold in heat and insulate you better than cotton. In addition, cotton absorbs water much more than wool. Wool, in general, will keep you dryer.




