
First of all I hope all of you guys had a great summer like I did. I spent it working at Many Point Scout Camp near the Park Rapids - Detroit Lakes area. It's the third largest Boy Scout camp in the nation and held over 4,000 scouts this year during 8 weeks. The camp lies on the shores of Many Point Lake and they own eight and a half miles of lakeshore, which accounts for well over half of the shoreline of the 1700 acre lake. It is mostly an undeveloped shoreline making it a cool lake to fish. It was also recently restocked with muskies. I was really excited to try and do lots of fishing this year especially for muskies so I packed up some small baits and a rod and headed to camp.

For the first week of camp we have mentoring from experts to improve the counselors knowledge of the merit badges. I was very jealous of the fishing merit badge counselors when I heard they got to go fishing with guys from the Fargo Muskies Inc. chapter all day. I ended up talking to the guys at lunch to find out if they were even fishing for muskies on the lake because it was only restocked in 2006. There was good news to me because they had been fishing Muskie and I found out they were getting fish in the 30 to 38 range and the biggest was a 41. This got me excited. I had also seen a couple of 30" range fish swimming near our beach during the rest of staff week. Unfortunately I was a little busier than expected and didn't quite have the dedication to get up to often before breakfast at 7:45 or go out after we got done at 9:00 PM in the evening. I ended up doing most of my fishing time during the hour we got off before dinner. There was an awesome cabbage finger and sunken island just off the shore of our beach. A kayak with a double showgirl turned out to be the best way to fish due the balance of a good retrieval pace and a decent amount of trolling power the bucktail gave my kayak. I just fan casted in the direction I wanted to go and the resistance of the lure and the water would pull me there. Early in the season I saw a lot of small fish in the 20inch range. After a couple of weeks without seeing a big fish I was starting to second-guess the area. One day I was planning on going during my off hour with another staff member but laundry held me up a little longer than I wanted. I got to the beach and he was just coming in and asked me if I still wanted to go out. I said "sure, might as well" so I quick grabbed my rod and my pliers and jumped into a kayak with my full class A Boy Scout uniform on not exactly expecting to catch a fish. I decided to head out a little deeper where I saw a boat catch a muskie the week before. Finally right at the boat one hit. What a blast fishing out of a kayak, being at eye level with the water when it hit a rod and a half length away. It was pretty cool. On the hookset my boat turned 180 degrees. It towed me around pretty good conveniently and thankfully toward shore. Finally with a short one-handed paddle, I got to shore landed the fish and had time for a quick picture and release. It wasn't exactly a monster but still fun at 36". It also turned out to be the new camp record. I ended up only catching one more fish in the same spot that was about 25" 3 days later. I saw probably 10 more fish in this 50ft by 50ft area not knowing what was exactly there at the time. I checked the DNR's maps when I got home and it turned out that the area was in the vicinity of a sunken island other maps didn't show.

One more quick story. Our beach director was swimming by the Aqua tramp and saw a Muskie near the floating trampoline. He yelled to my brother saying, "Hey Pete, there's a Muskie swimming out here". A young scout heard this and asked, "What's a Muskie?" to which the beach director said, "It's a little tinny fish about this big" He held out his thumb and pointer finger about 2 inches apart. When the young scout turned away, the beach director looked back at Peter and held his arms spread as far apart as he could, without saying a word.




